Dietary Restrictions and Exercise	Patients with cardiac sarcoidosis need to fast or eat a low carbohydrate diet for 18 hours prior to the PET. Please confirm this with your doctor before making adjustments to your diet.	 Please fast for 6 hours prior to your PET scan appointment. You can drink water or other beverages that do not contain sugar or milk (e.g., tap water or tea). Please do not eat candy, or chew gum. Diabetic Patients	 On the day of the PET scan, diabetic medication and insulin should be administered only after having completed the scan. If it is difficult to withhold insulin because of your medical condition, please consult with your doctor. Other medications can be taken as usual. 	◆ PET Scan Procedure: The whole PET scan procedure takes about two - three hours. You will not be allowed to leave the PET scan room until the scan has been completed. After your blood glucose level is measured, you will receive an intravenous injection of a tracer medication (FDG). You will then be asked to rest for one hour as that the tracer medication can be distributed.	 Depending on the progress of the scan, the actual scanning time may be longer than originally stated. If you have claustrophobia (fear of being in a closed space), please inform the PET scan room staff in advance.
Others	If you cannot lie still because of claustrophobia (fear of being in a closed space) or pain, please consult with your doctor. Note: The actual scanning takes about 30 minutes.	so that the tracer medication can be distributed throughout the body. Prior to the scan, you will be asked to empty your bladder.
